

TULSA JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

CONSTITUTION

Effective Date: January 1, 2000

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be known as The Tulsa Junior Chamber of Commerce.

ARTICLE II – AFFILIATION

This organization shall be affiliated with the Oklahoma Junior Chamber of commerce, the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce and Junior Chamber International.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be civic service through the organized efforts of the young people of the community, to promote the welfare of the community and it's citizens through active, constructive projects. It shall be the further purpose of this organization to provide the young people constituting its membership, training in leadership and civic consciousness to better their usefulness as citizens.

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP

The membership of this organization shall be divided into three (3) classifications.

- A. Regular Members: Any person of good character between the ages of twenty-one (21) and thirty-nine (39) inclusive who shall meet the requirements in Article I, Section 5 of the By-Laws and is eligible for Regular Membership in this organization.
- B. Sustaining Members: Any person, firm or corporation desiring to support this organization financially shall be eligible for Sustaining Membership in this organization.
- C. Honorary Members:
 - 1. Shall be recommended by a vote of the majority of the entire Board of Directors and approved by a majority of the regular members present at any regularly scheduled General Membership Meeting.
 - 2. Honorary membership may be bestowed upon any person, irrespective of age.
 - 3. Honorary Member for Life: Any member who shall have reached the age of thirty-nine (39) years, and who shall have been a member in good standing of a local chapter of the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce shall be entitled to have their name submitted for approval as an Honorary Member for Life.

ARTICLE V – GOVERNMENT

- A. The government of this organization shall be vested in a body known as the Board of Directors.
- B. Such body shall be comprised of the Executive Officers and the Board of Directors of this organization selected by the general membership in a manner prescribed by the By-Laws and Standing Rules.

ARTICLE VI – AMENDMENT

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the regular members in good standing at any regular or special general membership meeting, provided that written notice of the proposed amendment(s) and the time, date and place of the meeting shall be given to all members at least fifteen (15) days in advance, verifiable by postmark, by mailing or in the official chapter publication.

ARTICLE VII – DISSOLVEMENT OF ORGANIZATION

In the event that this organization should cease to exist whether it be by a vote of the membership, revocation of its organizational or corporate charter or if it may cease to function in a manner consistent with these Constitution, By-Laws and Standing Rules, the funds and assets of the organization will be managed in the following manner:

- A. All financial obligations will be immediately met in full.
- B. Any additional funds and/or assets will revert to the control of a committee to be comprised of the immediate three (3) past presidents of this organization, and the President of the Oklahoma Junior Chamber of Commerce.
- C. Said funds and/or assets will be distributed to charities and/or other organizations that are based and operate in the City of Tulsa and that directly benefit the citizens of Tulsa, in a manner consistent with a majority of said committee.
